Course: *The Pornographic Age and Victory in Christ*

Course Description: - The Pornographic Age and Victory in Christ is designed to fortify the New Testament church and the Christian home against the particular dangers of the internet age. The victory is not one or two things; it is not an addiction program; it is the full-orbed Christian life that we see in the New Testament Scripture. The Pornographic Age and Victory in Christ is for those who have become entangled in pornography. The Pornographic Age and Victory in Christ is very practical. It aims to help the student to be sure of his salvation, to recognize the characteristics of a sound church, to be plugged into a New Testament church, to establish an effectual daily Bible study habit, to pursue a life-long Bible education, to become a teacher in order to help others, to walk in the Spirit, to put off the old man and put on the new, to have a biblical testing mindset, to put on the whole armor of God, to unplug from temptation.

General Course Procedure:

Review Questions are "Open Book"

Tests are to be taken "Closed Book"

Reading assignments - As the student reads the material in the book, the corresponding review questions are to be answered. Key verses appearing on review questions should be memorized.

Review for test - The student should study the material until the Review Questions can be answered without having to look up the answer.

Tests - The student will take tests during the course. The questions will be short answer and will be based on the review questions.

Evaluation:

The grade will be the average score of all tests.

100-90 = A; 89-80 = B; 79-70 = C; below 70 = D (failing)

The Necessity of a Supervisor (Proctor) - If the student is taking the course by himself and not as part of a class, it is imperative that he or she find someone to supervise the studies. The supervisor can be a relative, pastor, teacher, or friend. The individual must be capable, dependable, and committed to the task of supervising the student's progress through the course. This entails (1) making sure that the student completes the studies in a timely fashion, (2) checking the assignments, and (3) overseeing the testing.

Schedule: This course may be taken at a pace which is decided by the student. If the student has a Supervisor (proctor) all timeframes and requirements should be fully agreed upon before the student begins the course.

To encourage a steady progress to finish the course, it is suggested that at the end of each week the student should complete a self-report. This report should reflect the work that was accomplished. A determination should be made as to if the student is on schedule.

Review Questions: The review questions are designed to draw the student's attention to the most important points of the lessons and to help him remember these after the course is finished. They are also designed to prepare the student for the tests. The student should first go through the review questions and try to answer them without the textbook. Afterward, he should go back and find the answers using the textbook. Finally, he/she should check answers against the review question answer sheet.

Student Assignments - Also see "The Students Responsibility" in the "Way of Life Bible College" chapter of the book.

Reading assignments - As the student reads the material in the book the corresponding review questions are to be answered.

Review for test - the student will review the pages read and the review questions answered to prepare for the test.

Tests - the student will take tests during the course. The questions will be short answer and will be based on the review questions. The tests are used to measure how much material the student has retained from the course.

Student Projects: These are provided as "extra" material to the course. They will provide great benefit to the serious student. You will find the projects at the end of the book under the "Student Projects" chapter.

Study Plan: You may study and complete the course at your own pace. The important thing is to set a daily schedule and stick to it. God requires first place ("But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness," Mt. 6:33). And since He has magnified His Word above His very name (Ps. 138:2), it is evident that He intends that we should make the study of His Word the very highest priority. Tips: 1.) Make Bible study a high priority, 2.) Establish a time, 3.) Establish a place, 4.) Have your study tools at hand, 5.) Set a schedule and stick to it.

To help you plan your study, the Course Plan below shows the total number of Review Questions for each section of test material. Questions may have multiple-part answers

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Course Plan: The course may be offered in many different settings and situations, therefore, we do not provide a specific plan or time frame to administer and complete the course.

To plan your schedule simply look over all the material and consider the workload (reading the subject matter, answering the Review Questions, and taking the tests.) Set a schedule that best fits your needs. Below is some information that will help. You will need to determine how much material to cover for each course "session" (day) that you wish to have. Tests vary in size and scope so you will need to plan accordingly.

Note that some the review and test questions have multiple answers. The "Review Question Answers" given below are the total number of answers.

This course has 247 total Review Questions (some have multiple answers). If you study and learn 10 questions and answers per "day" you would need 25 "days" to learn the material. Eleven days total would be needed for the tests and you would probably want at least one day to review for each test. Therefore, it would take about 47 days to complete this course (25+11+11). This does not include time watching the videos or doing the extra student projects.

Again stress that you should make a plan that works for you and your situation.
