Answer: Zebedee, Salome

Answer: The epistle was written to believers to perfect their fellowship with God and to increase the blessing of their Christian lives.

Answer: It is stated in the first four verses.
4. What is the second major theme of 1 John?
Answer: It was written to refute false teaching that was spreading in that day and to expose false Christians.
5. In what passage is this theme summarized (chapter)?
Answer: 1 John 2

Answer: Antichrist

Answer: The Word's eternity
12. What are three passages that teach that Jesus is the Creator (book and chapter)? (3 answers)
Answer: John 1; Colossians 1; Hebrews 1
13. What are two verses that say that Jesus is the image of God? (2 answers)
Answer: Colossians 1:15; Hebrews 1:3
14. What are the first two aspects of the fruit of the Spirit? (2 answers)
Answer: Love, joy

15. What is John emphasizing when he says that “God is light”?

Answer: God is perfectly holy.

16. What is the standard of holiness that John gives in 1 John?

Answer: To walk in the light as He is in the light
