1. In what two Old Testament passages (book and chapter) is Melchizedek mentioned? (2 answers)

Answer: Genesis 14; Psalm 110

2. What is the meaning of “Jerusalem”?

Answer: Righteousness - peace

3. List three verses that prove that Christ had no beginning? (3 answers)

Answer: Isaiah 9:6; Micah 5:2; John 1:1; Colossians 1:17; 1 John 1:3

4. What does it mean that Jesus was “separate from sinners”?

Answer: He has no sin.

5. In what way was the Old Covenant defective?

Answer: It could not make man righteous and reconcile him with God.

6. According to Hebrews 9:10-12, what are three things that we find in the New Covenant that were not in the Old? (3 answers)

Answer: (1) God writes His laws on men’s hearts. (2) Every man personally knows the Lord. (3) Sins are entirely forgiven.

7. What are three national aspects of the New Covenant, according to Jeremiah 31? (3 answers)

Answer: (1) Israel will be regathered. (2) Israel will be blessed and enlarged. (3) The city of Jerusalem will be glorified.

8. What New Testament passage (3 verses) says the New Covenant will be fulfilled in Israel when Christ comes?

Answer: Romans 11:25-27

9. What association do New Testament believers have with the New Covenant?

Answer: They participate in the spiritual blessings.

10. What does “propitiate” mean?

Answer: Satisfy a debt

11. What verse in the New Testament says, “by his own blood he entered in once having obtained eternal redemption for us”?

Answer: Hebrews 9:12

12. What is the meaning of “redemption”?

Answer: To ransom, to purchase with a price

13. What verse in Hebrews mentions all three members of the Trinity?

Answer: Hebrews 9:14

14. What verse says God calls men through the Gospel?

Answer: 2 Thessalonians 2:14

15. What Old Testament verse is referenced in Hebrews 9:22?

Answer: Leviticus 17:11

16. What two things were required for the atonement? (2 answers)

Answer: Blood and death

17. What verse says it is appointed to men to die once and then the judgment?

Answer: Hebrews 9:27
