1. What three events are described in Isaiah 36-39?

Answer: (1) The destruction of the Assyrian army (2) The healing of Hezekiah (3) The visit by the Babylonian ambassadors

2. Why did the king of Babylon send ambassadors to Jerusalem?

Answer: He was seeking an alliance against Assyria.

3. What did Isaiah prophesy about Hezekiah's sons after the ambassadors left?

Answer: He said Hezekiah's sons would be eunuchs in the palace of Babylon.

4. What two verses of Isaiah mark the major turning point in the book?

Answer: Isa. 40:1-2

5. What chapters in Isaiah contain prophecies of Jehovah's Servant?

Answer: 42; 49; 50; 52; 53

6. What book and chapter says Christ "took upon him the form of a servant"?

Answer: Php. 2

7. Which of the Gospels depicts Christ as God's Servant?

Answer: Mark

8. What verse says Christ "offered Himself without spot to God"?

Answer: Hebrews 9:14

9. Isaiah 42:1 says, "Behold my servant." How is this the theme of the Bible?

Answer: Christ as the chosen of God is the theme of the Bible; all men are to look upon Christ and believe on Him.

10. What passage says Jesus was conceived by the Spirit?

Answer: Mt. 1:18-20

11. What verse says Jesus was raised from the dead by the Spirit?

Answer: Ro. 8:11

12. What is the meaning of Isa. 42:2, "He shall not cry, nor lift up, nor cause his voice to be heard in the street"?

Answer: Christ was not a revolutionary.

13. What is the meaning that Christ will not break the bruised reed or quench the smoking flax?

Answer: It describes Christ's tender care for the weakest believer.

14. What are three covenants that are fulfilled in Christ?

Answer: Abraham, David, New

15. What three chapters in Isaiah prophesy Christ healing the blind?

Answer: Isa 29; 35; 42

16. In what book and chapter of the Gospels did Jesus apply Isaiah 53 to Himself?

Answer: Luke 22

17. What are two other New Testament passages (book and chapter) that apply Isaiah 53 to Jesus?

Answer: Acts 8; 1 Peter 2

18. What is the meaning of “the army of the LORD” in Isa. 53:1?

Answer: Christ is the almighty strength of God for salvation.

19. What is the meaning of Isa. 53:2, “a root out of a dry ground”?

Answer: Christ had a supernatural birth and did not come from the first Adam.

20. How many times does Isaiah 53 emphasize that Christ suffered in the place of sinners?

Answer: 12

21. What are two words that describe this?

Answer: vicarious - substitutionary

22. What are seven words in Isaiah 53 that describe Jesus’ physical suffering?

Answer: stricken, smitten, afflicted, wounded, bruised, stripes, death

23. Quote Isaiah 53:6

Answer: “All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.”

24. What does Isa. 53:11 mean when it says “He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied”?

Answer: God was satisfied with the price that the Son paid for man’s sins.

25. Isa. 53:6 says Christ bore the sin of “all,” but Isa. 53:12 says he bore the sin of “many.” What does this mean?

Answer: He bore the sin of all in that He made it possible for all to be saved, but He bore the sin of many in that He only saves those who believe.

26. Quote 2 Corinthians 5:21

Answer: “For he hath made him *to be* sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.”

27. What does Isa. 53:8 mean when it says, “He was taken ... from judgment”?

Answer: Jesus’ trial was unjust

Answer: the stars of heaven - the sand of the seashore
