1. What three events are described in Isaiah 36-39? (3 answers)

Answer: (1) The destruction of the Assyrian army (2) The healing of Hezekiah (3) The visit by the Babylonian ambassadors

2. What two verses of Isaiah mark the major turning point in the book?

Answer: Isa. 40:1-2

3. What book and chapter says Christ “took upon him the form of a servant”?

Answer: Php. 2

4. Which of the Gospels depicts Christ as God’s Servant?

Answer: Mark

5. What verse says Jesus was raised from the dead by the Spirit?

Answer: Ro. 8:11

6. What is the meaning that Christ will not break the bruised reed or quench the smoking flax?

Answer: It describes Christ’s tender care for the weakest believer.

7. What are three covenants that are fulfilled in Christ? (3 answers)

Answer: Abraham, David, New

8. What is a chapter in Isaiah that prophesies Christ healing the blind?

Answer: Isa 29; 35; 42

9. What is the meaning of Isa. 53:2, “a root out of a dry ground”?

Answer: Christ had a supernatural birth and did not come from the first Adam.

10. How many times does Isaiah 53 emphasize that Christ suffered in the place of sinners?

Answer: 12

11. What are two words that describe this? (2 answers)

Answer: vicarious - substitutionary

12. What does Isa. 53:11 mean when it says “He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied”?

Answer: God was satisfied with the price that the Son paid for man’s sins.

13. Isa. 53:6 says Christ bore the sin of “all,” but Isa. 53:12 says he bore the sin of “many.” What does this mean?

Answer: He bore the sin of all in that He made it possible for all to be saved, but He bore the sin of many in that He only saves those who believe.
