


WE MUST HAVE DIVISION ~ By David Cloud

One of the preachers attending the Northside Baptist Church conference this month in Adelaide, Australia, where I preached 22 times on "Understanding Bible Prophecy," recounted how he met me for the first time twenty something years ago when I was teaching a mini-course at Sydney Baptist Bible College. At that time, he asked what my goal was, and I shocked him by replying, "My goal is to bring division."

What I meant was that I want to help divide the sound from the unsound. I was talking about biblical separation. I was not talking about carnal division. I was talking about biblical division.

That is my goal today more passionately than ever, because I know so much more about the deep compromise that is permeating Ind. Baptists and the compromise grows larger and deeper with each passing decade. If ever there was a time for sound Ind. Baptists to put on their separation hat and fly the separation flag, it is today!



If there is no clear division between the remnant who are obeying God's Word and the compromisers who aren't, between the spiritual and the worldly, between the obedient and the disobedient, between the true disciples of Christ and the pretenders, all will go down the same drain that feeds into "evangelicalism" and from there to the "broader church" with all of its gross sins and heresies. When churches get together in conferences such as the annual National Baptist Fellowship in Australia, blessings can happen but the potential for the furtherance of sin and error is greater than the potential for blessing because of the mixed multitude aspect. God's people can be stirred by the right preaching of God's Word in a mixed multitude, but if they go back to wishy washy, lukewarm, worldly, compromising churches, whatever revival was experienced will be quashed.

Some have boasted that the NBF meeting in 2023 was attended by 600. That's the same old pragmatic "big numbers" junk thinking that has been a major error among Ind. Baptists since J. Frank Norris and Jack Hyles. Let's forget numbers and consider quality. It would be a good education to somehow take an effectual survey of the 600-member crowd, beginning with the pastors, to see where things really stand doctrinally, spiritually, and morally. We know that Ind. Baptists today are a pretty sorry mixed multitude overall. I have discussed this with a great many preachers. From my perspective, a big majority of them are extremely weak (not a small minority) and should not be considered New Testament churches. They would not be considered New Testament churches by the Baptists of old (we only have to go back to the 19th century). They don't stand for anything; they are moving rapidly toward an evangelical position; they are playing with contemporary music; they are frightfully shallow in Bible knowledge; they aren't careful enough about baptism and church membership; they are largely uneducated in the major issues facing God's people

today; they are weak in separation; the pastors are more sports minded, etc., than Bible minded. These churches know little to nothing about true pilgrim Christianity. They are not building strong Christian families that can raise up a godly seed. (A church's real character is reflected in the families and the youth; it is a biblical test.) In these churches, a young person sold out to Jesus Christ is either a rarity or non-existent. In a great many of them, the youth are largely gone. Typically the men are not the spiritual heads of the homes and the women are not keepers of the home. These churches are lukewarm at best, and lukewarm is no small thing; Christ hates it. They don't warn; they don't like warnings; and they criticize warners. The words "earnestly contend for the faith" might as well be a foreign language. A pastor that is a warrior for the truth of God's Word is *extremely* rare.

I know Buddy Smith, one of the speakers at the Australian conference this year, pretty well. He ignored Pastor Simeon Western's well-documented, gracious warning about the 2024 NBF. Pastor Smith used to promote my ministry. In fact, he used to warn about the NBF meetings. Pastor Smith is considered a strong man with a sound church, but it is a facade. When I preached a youth conference in Sydney in 2016, I first preached at a youth meeting jointly hosted by Pastor Smith's church and another one. I was shocked! His youth leader was a wishy-washy new evangelical in thinking; the youth leader's wife was dressed extremely immodestly as a terrible example for the youth; my preaching was not well received by that worldly crew. They were not serious Bible students and don't love separation; they were there for fun and games; but they were the product of those churches. When I confronted the pastor, he broke friendship with me. He claims that I don't understand the battle in Australia and how difficult it is for a church to find workers and how they must do the best they can with weak people, but as a pioneer missionary in a place much harder than Australia I understand all of that. Further, what I understand or don't understand is not the issue. The church is Christ's, not mans, and the Word of God is the Word of God, and we have no right to modify and soften and compromise God's standards for pragmatic reasons.

Baptists are pragmatists and traditionalists, not Biblicists; they are man-centered rather than Christ-centered. At least, that is what I have observed from my own experience and reading.

For some reason, some preachers want to *appear to be* strong; they put on a strong facade at times; but it is not what they really are, and when they have an opportunity to speak out on an important issue, they either keep silent or they take the weak side of things and tend to attack the messenger rather than the error he is exposing.

Further, preachers who were once warriors for the truth have given up the battle.

Pastor Smith is an example. In his former *Heads Up!* magazine, Jan. 6, 2012, he wrote the following:

"In Australia, forty years ago, pastors gathered together to comfort, encourage and deepen one another's walk with the Lord. The gatherings became addictive and grew and acquired a life of their own. The spirit of the age imparted an inertia, a momentum of pragmatism. No longer did the fellowship confront its culture.

"Instead, the new leaders gave it a new watchword. Conform. Conform to win them. The gates were opened wider and wider. Anyone and everyone was welcomed in. Textual critics, Hillsong music and theology, Augustine and all his deformed offspring, Ruckman and Co., Riplinger and all her husbands (!), Mighty Men (?), Purpose Drivelled pastors, Schaap and his books, and Sexton's IBFI. All are welcome!

"Pastor Charles Keen recently wrote, 'We need to develop some ecumenicalism within the parameters of fundamentalism.' He was only verbalising what had been going on in pastors fellowships for years. I have observed the same trend in the Baptist Union, the Southern Baptist Convention, the Baptist Bible Fellowship, The World Baptist Fellowship, The Fundamental Baptist Fellowship, The General Association of Regular Baptists, Southwide, the IBFI, and the IBFA here in Australia. The National Baptist Fellowship (Australia) is moving in the same direction.

"All pastors fellowships become ecumenical as they drift away from their founding principles" (*Heads Up!*, Jan. 6, 2012).

Twelve years later, Pastor Smith is preaching at the NBF.

The battle hasn't changed; preachers have changed. God's truth is under attack as never before. Who will stand up and be counted? Who is on the Lord's side?

We need warriors for the truth. Where are the young preacher warriors that the old timers have trained to take their place in the battle? There should be a large cadre of them.

In the early 1980s, I wrote to Warren Wiersbe and asked how he could be associated as an editor with *Christianity Today* in light of all of its great compromise and heresies, and he replied that we need to take off the gloves and pick up a towel. I rejected that counsel as a young missionary, and I reject it even more emphatically today. It is time to put on the gloves for fighting *and* pick up a towel of service; it is time to build up *and* to fight. Like Nehemiah. we need to wield the sword *and* the trowel (Ne. 4:17-18).

Warren Wiersbe was a New Evangelical through and through, and since his thinking reflects that of a large number of Ind. Baptists, they must also be New Evangelicals.

At about the same time, I corresponded over a period of a couple of years with David Otis Fuller, defender of the Greek Received Text and the King James Bible, and he concluded each communication with, "The battle is getting hotter and hotter, and I like it better and better"! Dr. Fuller's fight cost him many preacher friends and brought slanders upon his head, but he was not afraid of the battle for truth.

As laborers together with God, may He help us raise up warriors for the faith, both men and women, in these evil times.

"I have fought a good fight, I have finished *my* course, I have kept the faith" (2 Ti. 4:7).

"Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners" (1 Co. 15:33).

"Can two walk together, except they be agreed?" (Amos 3:3).

The Gettys represent new Reformed Calvinism. For four years, Keith led worship at Parkside Church, Cleveland, Ohio, pastored by Alistair Begg. This is the world of John Piper, David Platt, R.C. Sproul, Al Mohler, Jr., John MacArthur.

Reformed Calvinism itself is not biblically sound. It is a path to the world of Augustine, the church fathers, John Calvin, Protestantism, the Puritans, infant baptism. It is a path to Replacement Theology (the church is Israel). It is a path to Amillennialism and the rejection of the imminency of Christ's return and the loss of all of the spiritual benefits of that essential doctrine.

New Reformed Calvinism, unlike old Reformed Calvinism, is ecumenical. There are no strict boundaries. The Gettys associate in ministry with almost anybody: Pentecostal, Charismatic, Roman Catholic, deniers of the blood atonement (C.S. Lewis), theistic evolutionists (John Lennox). Keith Getty favorably quotes all sorts of unsound men. For example, in his 2017 book *Sing!* he quotes the Roman Catholic mystic J.R.R. Tolkien, Augustin, C.S. Lewis, and Sting.

New Reformed Calvinism is sympathetic toward Rome. The old Reformed men believed that Rome is the great whore of Revelation 17, drunken with the blood of the martyrs. But the new Reformed have ecumenical relationships with Rome. Consider The Gospel Coalition. The Getty's former pastor, Alistair Beggs was once the head of this organization. The web site promotes ecumenical unity. One report was entitled "The Urgency of Evangelical Ecumenism." The report "Should Christians Be Ecumenical?" said, "Can evangelicals and Catholics truly be together? ... Jesus' prayer for unity in the Body obligates me to see the ecumenical task as important for Christianity." This is false. Jesus' prayer has nothing to do ecumenism. In fact, Christ emphasized obedience to God's Word and the importance of truth (Joh. 17:6, 8, 14, 17, 19), which are *incompatible* with ecumenism. Yet this article was written by Trevin Wax, a Southern Baptist Wheaton College professor who associates closely with the Gettys.

And New Reformed Calvinism (also called neo-Puritan), unlike old Reformed Calvinism, is not separated from the world. In July 2019, longhaired rocker Alice Cooper gave his testimony at Parkside. They should rather have reproved him for his association with the vile world of rock & roll. Mark Driscoll, one of the most influential new Reformed Calvinists, said, "We are theologically conservative and CULTURALLY LIBERAL." His church in Seattle, Mars Hill, had New Year's Eve champagne dance parties.

Consider the issue of dress, which most churches today consider of little consequence, but it is a clear biblical issue. Kristyn Getty is one of the few contemporary worship artists that wears a dress of any kind in her performances, but she also wears skin-tight pants and low-cut tops and other types of immodest attire, so there is no consistency. There are no boundaries. And some of the other female musicians in the Getty performances are even less modest. An advertisement for the Getty's Sing! 2019 conference featured a young woman dancing an Irish dance in extremely tight pants. That type of thing is very sensual and has no place in Christian worship. A few years ago, when we asked for feedback from Christian men about how various types of female dress affect them morally, many made the observation that tight clothing is as seductive as slight clothing. One man wrote, "I would say the number one problem is any garment that is form fitting, be it jeans, pants, skirt, dress, shirt, whatever. Anything that is tight, no matter how long it is, leaves nothing to the imagination, and that defeats the whole purpose of covering the skin in the first place!" Another wrote, "One thing I see in my church is tight clothing. Oh,

it may very well be covering but it is revealing the shape in a woman. This can be even more tantalizing to a man." (See <u>"Tight Clothing and Modesty"</u> at www.wayoflife.org.)

The Gettys represent the "cool New Calvinism" that is sweeping through evangelicalism and the Southern Baptist Convention and that is capturing large numbers of "young fundamentalists."

It is influencing Bob Jones University graduates, which is probably why the school is being drawn to the Gettys.

A new form of Calvinism took the shape of a movement from about 2005, but it differed from the original in its acceptance of 'the world'. This critique written in 2009 was sharply attacked by new Calvinistic preachers but strongly endorsed by conservative preachers worldwide.

When I was a youngster and newly saved, it seemed as if the chief goal of all zealous Christians, whether Calvinistic or Arminian, was consecration. Sermons, books and conferences stressed this in the spirit of Romans 12.1-2, where the beseeching apostle calls believers to present their bodies a living sacrifice, and not to be conformed to this world. The heart was challenged and stirred. Christ was to be Lord of one's life, and self must be surrendered on the altar of service for him.

But now, it appears, there is a new Calvinism, with new Calvinists, which has swept the old objectives aside. A recent book, *Young, Restless, Reformed*, by Collin Hansen tells the story of how a so-called Calvinistic resurgence has captured the imaginations of thousands of young people in the USA, and this book has been reviewed with great enthusiasm in well-known magazines in the UK, such as *Banner of Truth*, *Evangelical Times*, and *Reformation Today*. This writer, however, was very deeply saddened to read it, because it describes a seriously distorted Calvinism falling far, far short of an authentic life of obedience to a sovereign God.

If this kind of Calvinism prospers, then genuine biblical piety will be under attack as never before. The author of the book is a young man (around 26 when he wrote it) who grew up in a Christian family and trained in secular journalism. We are indebted to him for the readable and wide-reaching survey he gives of this new phenomenon, but the scene is certainly not a happy one.

The author begins by describing the Passion conference at Atlanta in 2007, where 21,000 young people revelled in contemporary music, and listened to speakers such as John Piper proclaiming Calvinistic sentiments. And this picture is repeated many times through the book – large conferences being described at which the syncretism of worldly, sensation-stirring, high-decibel, rhythmic music, is mixed with Calvinistic doctrine.

We are told of thunderous music, thousands of raised hands, 'Christian' hip-hop and rap lyrics (the examples seeming inept and awkward in construction) uniting the doctrines of grace with the immoral drug-induced musical forms of worldly culture. Resolved is the brainchild of a member of Dr John MacArthur's pastoral staff, gathering thousands of young people annually, and featuring the usual mix of Calvinism and extreme charismatic-style worship. Young people are encouraged to feel the very same sensational nervous impact of loud rhythmic music on the body that they would experience in a large, worldly pop concert, complete with replicated lighting and atmosphere. At the same time they reflect on predestination and election. Worldly culture provides the bodily, emotional feelings, into which Christian thoughts are infused and floated. Biblical sentiments are harnessed to carnal entertainment.' (Pictures of this conference on their website betray the totally worldly, show business atmosphere created by the organizers.)

Truly proclaimed, the sovereignty of God must include consecration, reverence, sincere obedience to his will, and separation from the world. You cannot have Puritan soteriology without Puritan sanctification. You should not entice people to Calvinistic (or any) preaching by using worldly bait. We hope that young people in this movement will grasp the implications of the doctrines better than their teachers, and come away from the compromises. But there is a looming disaster in promoting this new form of Calvinism"



William Cowper (pronounced Cooper) (1731-1800) was one of the most prolific of British poets and hymn writers.

The son of an Anglican pastor who was chaplain to King George II, William began to show signs of severe depression during his student years studying for law. When faced with the bar examination for a position in the House of Lords at age 23, he was plagued by fear and became suicidal. He had to be confined for 18 months. This deep melancholy appeared off and on to the end of his life.

While living with a pastor friend, Morley Unwin, in the area of Olney, Cowper was converted and befriended by Pastor John Newton, author of "Amazing Grace." Newton lived next door to the Unwins. With Newton, Cowper was involved in the abolitionist movement, and wrote poems in support of the cause, including "The Negro's Complaint." From 1767 to 1770, Cowper was in good spirits, but upon the death of his brother that year, he descended into despondency.

He was haunted by thoughts that he was not predestined to salvation according to Calvinist "sovereign election" theology. At times he could trust God, and it was during these times that he wrote his famous hymns. He said that of all the gifts God gives to us, God, Himself, is the greatest. But at other times he was crippled by the fear of being among the non-elect and abandoned by God. His final poem, "The Castaway," reflected this mindset. Consider the first two stanzas:

> Obscurest night involv'd the sky, Th' Atlantic billows roar'd, When such a destin'd wretch as I, Wash'd headlong from on board, Of friends, of hope, of all bereft, His floating home for ever left.

No braver chief could Albion boast Than he with whom he went, Nor ever ship left Albion's coast, With warmer wishes sent. He lov'd them both, but both in vain, Nor him beheld, nor her again.

How different this terribly gloomy poem is to faith-filled hymns such as "There Is a Fountain Filled with Blood" and "O For a Closer Walk with God"!

Partly to help his friend, Newton suggested that they collaborate on a collection of hymns. Called *Olney Hymns*, it was published in 1779. Cowper contributed 68 of the 348 hymns, including "God Moves in a Mysterious Way," "O For a Closer Walk with God," and "There Is a Fountain Filled with Blood."

In 1772, Cowper descended yet again into dark depression. "He now sunk into an apparently hopeless state of gloom and wretched despondency, that continued, without a ray of sunshine, for five long years. ... The few remaining years of Cowper were sad enough. Deeper and deeper fell the shadows, with intervals—growing shorter and fewer—of glimmering light" ("William Cowper," Hymnologyarchive.com).

Basically, I thought your book was a master class on how to move the church towards godliness. It is loaded with Biblical truths, loving warnings, foundational challenges, and practical suggestions to move churches towards godliness and away from worldliness. You held up some church practices and philosophies in the light of God's word, exposed some flaws, and offered some correctives. It surely is the kind of book church members and leaders ought to read often to help strengthen God's precious flock.

I have benefitted tremendously from it as a missionary in trying to set up a church to start off on the right path. 
The Biblical and practical suggestions in pp. 66-71 is a gold mine all on its own with further resources from **wayoflife.org**. This section alone is worth the entire book.

DIGGING IN THE WALLS

God commanded the prophet Ezekiel to dig in the walls of Israel's temple and observe the evils being done in secret by apostate religious leaders of that day. "Then said he unto me, Son of man, dig now in the wall ... And he said unto me, Go in, and behold the wicked abominations that they do here. So I went in and saw. ..." (Ezek. 8:7-10).

Ezekiel was then instructed to preach against the errors of the leaders and to tell the people the things he had witnessed.

"Therefore prophesy against them, prophesy, O son of man. ... Then I spake unto them of the captivity all the things that the Lord had shewed me" (Ezek. 11:4,25).

The hour in which we live is very similar to that of Ezekiel's day. Many of those who profess to be the people of God are apostate. Catholic Church has identified herself with Revelation 17? "In 1825, Pope Leo XII struck a medal, bearing on the one side his own image, and on the other, that of the Church of Rome symbolized as a 'Woman,' holding in her left hand a cross, and in her right a CUP, with the legend around her, 'Sedet super universum,' 'The whole world is her seat" (Alexander Hislop, The Two Babylons). "And there came one of the seven angels which had the seven vials, and talked with me, saying unto me, Come hither; I will shew unto thee the judgment of the great whore that sitteth upon many waters: With whom the kings of the earth have committed fornication, and the inhabitants of the earth have been made drunk with the wine of her fornication. So he carried me away in the spirit into the wilderness: and I saw a woman sit upon a scarlet coloured beast, full of names of blasphemy, having seven heads and ten horns. And the woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet colour, and decked with gold and precious stones and pearls, having a golden cup in her hand full of abominations and filthiness of her fornication: And upon her forehead was a name written. By this metaphor, the whole counsel of God is a 47-string grand concert harp, but these ministries limit their focus to one or two strings. It might be the string of the family (Focus on the Family), pro-life (Evangelicals for Life), disaster relief (Samaritan's Ministries), evangelism (Laurie, Palau, Graham), poverty (World Vision), creationism (Answers In Genesis. Institute for Creation Research), campus ministry (Campus complementarianism Crusade). (Council on Biblical Manhood and child Womanhood), evangelism Evangelism Fellowship), (Child apologetics (Ligonier Ministries), etc. Multitudes of evangelical ministries are one string harps. They might play that one string well, but they tend to avoid anything that would interfere with that particular emphasis (and its fund raising). In contrast, the Bible's emphasis is on "all things."



Consider Christ's command in Matthew 28:20, "teaching them to observe ALL things whatsoever I have commanded you." Consider Acts 20:27, where Paul stated his commitment to "declare unto you ALL the counsel of God." God's people are to "prove ALL things; hold fast that which is good" (1 Th. 5:21). (Paul instructed God's people to be followers of him; see 1 Co. 4:16; 11:1; Php. 4:9; 2 Th. 3:7, 9.) Jude instructed every believer to "earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints" (Jude 1:3). As Jude didn't delineate what part of the faith is to be defended, the obvious meaning is that all of it is to be defended. Whatever aspect of the faith is under attack at any given time, God's people should rally to its defense rather than claim that it is a "non-essential." If we are to teach all things and declare all things and prove all things and earnestly contend for all things, it is obvious that nothing in God's Word is to be ignored for the sake of Christian unity. fellowship, evangelism, creationism, the family, right to life, caring for the poor, or any other reason. The all string harp of God's Word can only be found in a sound New Testament church. It alone is divinely appointed to be "the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Timothy 3:15), and it alone can be the pillar and ground of all truth (including baptism, the Lord's Supper, discipline, interpretation of prophecy, etc.). The crying need of the hour is for doctrinally sound, life-changing, pilgrim-

THE BARE BONE FACTS (Friday Church News Notes, July 5, 2024, <u>w w w . w a y o f l i f e . o r g</u>, <u>fbns@wayoflife.org</u>, 866-295-4143)

The following is from CreationMoments.com, June 14, 2024: "When an engineer builds a building, a bridge or some other structure, he must build it so that it can withstand both stretching and compressing forces. In designing the structure to withstand both kinds of these forces, he must anticipate how much of each force the structure might face in its lifetime. Some materials, like cast iron and concrete, are very good at withstanding compression forces but very poor in handling stretching forces. Using one of these materials to build a structure that undergoes tensile or stretching forces could lead to disaster. Now let's apply our basic engineering information to the problem of building a frame or skeleton for a living creature. Although you may weigh only 130 pounds, your long leg bone will very likely have to be prepared to deal with more than 1,000 pounds of compression and hundreds of pounds of tension from the muscles that are anchored to it. It's a good thing, then, that normal bone is three times as strong as good solid wood and nearly as strong as iron! Tests have shown that the tensile strength of bone is 35,000 pounds per square inch, while iron is 40,000 pounds per square inch. But bone material is better than iron because it is three times lighter and much more flexible.

Using this standard, it is impossible to support the idea that morality is secondary to economics, the military, border security, supreme court justices, oil exploration, etc. By all counts, Trump is an arrogant man, which is very much a moral issue. Does it matter? The Bible says, "Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall" (Proverbs 16:18). Apparently arrogance is a fundamental issue of life, including political life. If God's judgment is on a proud man, what will happen to a nation that elects a spectacularly proud man to its highest office? Could it be that Trump's legal troubles are not fundamentally a political attack but rather a judgment of God? Could it be that he is not a victim? Trump has defied God's law of holy matrimony by a playboy lifestyle and multiple divorces, fathering five children by three women. He supports the

homosexual rights agenda, as we have documented elsewhere. He supports the murder of unborn children so long as they aren't too old in the womb. His gross lack of morality has now influenced the entire Republican Party, which is supposed to be very "conservative." Note this from the Washington Times: "The Republican National Committee took cues from presumptive presidential nominee Donald Trump on Monday and made a giant step toward passing a party platform that softens its stance on federal abortion limits. The RNC's platform committee signed off on a Trump-inspired vision that omits the party's embrace of a human life amendment to the Constitution and a 20-week federal ban on most abortions" ("RNC adopts Trumpinspired platform," Washington Times, July 8, 2024). What motivates such a thing? Cheap, filthy politics with its love of money and power. God's people can't control what the world does, but if Bible-believing churches would spend as much time in serious intercessory prayer and serious Bible study and building holy churches and holy homes and holy children and holy youth and in aggressive evangelism as they do in messing around with politics, sports, vain activities on social media, selfies, empty chatter, etc., THAT would change things. At 74 years old, the Lord's program for holy, biblicallyeducated, zealous New Testament churches is what I am focused on like a laser as long as God gives me health, and it is paying wonderful dividends even in this present life and apostate times. I wholeheartedly recommend it. The real answer is in God's house. not the White House.

JOHN 17 UNITY (Friday Church News Notes, July 12, 2024, <u>w w w . w a y o f l i f e . o r g</u>, <u>fbns@wayoflife.org</u>, 866-295-4143) -

John 17:21 is used as a major proof text for Christian unity. "That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me." The ecumenical interpretation is patently false and impossible. First, John 17 is not a commandment addressed to men; it is Christ's High Priestly prayer addressed to God the Father, and the prayer was answered. It describes a spiritual unity that is created by God among born again saints. Second, John 17 is a unity based on salvation and truth and obedience and separation from the world. "I have manifested thy name unto the men which thou gavest me out of the world: thine they were, and thou gavest them me; and THEY HAVE KEPT THY WORD. ... For I HAVE GIVEN UNTO THEM THE WORDS WHICH THOU GAVEST ME; AND THEY HAVE RECEIVED THEM, and have known surely that I came out from thee, and they have believed that thou didst send me. ... I HAVE GIVEN THEM THY WORD; AND THE WORLD HATH HATED THEM, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. ... Sanctify them through THY TRUTH: thy word is TRUTH. ... And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified THROUGH THE TRUTH" (John 17:6, 8, 14, 17, 19). John 17 is not a unity of true Christians with false, sound doctrine



with heresy. It is not a "unity in diversity" that ignores doctrinal differences for the sake of an enlarged fellowship. It is not a unity of professing Christians who love the world. Third, to accept the ecumenical interpretation of John 17 requires disobedience to plain Scriptures such as the following: Romans 16:17; 2 Corinthians 6:14-18; 1 Timothy 6:20-21; 2 Timothy 2:16-18; 3:5; Jude 1:3.

One man wrote, "I have read and understand your thoughts on Trump and now I await your thoughts on Joe Biden." I replied, "You missed the point." He said, "Okay, help me get to the point." I decided I would try to do that. FOLLOWING IS MY REPLY: My point is not politics. You are thinking politics, but I'm not talking about politics. I'm talking about measuring everything by Scripture

rather than by "right wing conservative politics." I'm talking about living a true biblical Christian life in this present world. In all of my remarks about politics and America and Limbaugh and Levin and Trump, etc., over the last several years, I can summarize the lessons as follows: First, we must have a biblical testing mindset. We must be serious Bible students, rightly dividing Scripture and rightly applying it by God's Spirit, and we must measure



everything by it. We must be the strong meat Christians of Hebrews 5:12-14, being skillful in God's Word and having our senses exercised to discern both good and evil. When we do that today, our thinking will be far different from "political right-wing conservatives." Second, we must focus our attention on the business God has given us and not be sidetracked from it. That business is what Christ described and emphasized between His resurrection and ascension (Mt. 28:18-20; Mr. 16:15; Lu. 24:44-48; Ac. 1:8). This is the business that is emphasized in the book of Acts. It is a business that is being accomplished less today than in the past 50 years. It is a dying business, whereas it should be a growing business. Ask the mission boards. Whether you support them or not, they are a bellwether of

missionary work. We must focus on preaching the gospel to every lost soul in every nation before the opportunity is gone. Third, we focus on the New Testament church. It is the headquarters for the Great Commission. It is the pillar and ground of the truth. It is God's house. It is the training and equipping center for God's soldiers, the builder of godly homes that can raise a godly seed, the educational center for the preparation of God's ambassadors. If God's people focus on building strong New Testament homes and churches, that will do more to help the nation than any amount of political activity. Fourth we must be pilgrim Christians. We must believe and live like our citizenship is in heaven. We must be pilgrims more than patriots. We must be Christians who live according to Colossians 4:1-4; Hebrews 11:13-16; and Peter 2:11-12. We must leave a light footprint in this present world, knowing that this life is exceedingly brief and the next life is the "long home" (Ec. 12:5). Fifth, we must refuse to be frustrated and fearful. As part of a basic education, we were taught how to construct a formal letter, which was a letter to a stranger, whether an individual or an organization.
