
### THE FRUIT OF HYLESISM ~ By David Cloud

The fruit of the Jack Hyles model and methodology has often consisted of moral and spiritual shipwreck.

Multitudes of former members of Hyles-type churches, having witnessed so much error and hypocrisy, have abandoned church altogether. Or they have explored the contemporary emerging philosophy, having allegedly found more spiritual reality in those circles than they witnessed in "fundamentalism."

Being the products of shallow evangelism, many of these have never been biblically converted. They have prayed a sinner's prayer but haven't been born again. Having never had a real and dynamic relationship with Christ, they are man-followers, and when the man fails, they are offended and quit, sometimes blaming Christ and the church for something that is man's fault alone.



Even if they were truly saved, they were not properly discipled and grounded in the Scriptures and in solid doctrinal truth. All too typically they have been used or neglected and sometimes abused, but not shepherded.

The following is one of the many testimonies we have received through the years of the wretched fruit of the Hyles philosophy:

"I have so much to say, I do not know where to start. I was brought up in an extremely fundamental ... Hyles and Bob Gray worshiping church in southern California. At one point this church, which averaged no more than 200 on Wednesday nights (at its peak in the late 90's), was 3rd in America in baptisms, with more than 10,000 in a single year. I was one of the 'top' teenagers in the church and I was 'in' as far as popularity and promise at our church. It was a shallow, man praising, numbers driven Christianity that has driven countless men, women, families, and teenagers to bitterness and a hatred for anything that has to do with the Bible or God. I know because I was one of them. I have many old friends who have told me they could never trust a man and/or pastor cause of the trauma they went through.

"My family is currently struggling and I am praying for my family as they, too, have grown bitter. My family is currently looking to go to the complete other side of Christianity (new evangelical/praise chapel type) and I am praying and hoping they see Christ and the Bible more real as I have during this last year. I have recently read your book 'The Two Jacks' and am currently

I have had to "reset" my whole foundation of salvation, repentance and following Christ. I cannot even tell you how that the book 'The Two Jacks' took me on a roller coaster of emotions, from anger to disbelief, but I realized that all my emotions and EXTREMELY high, almost worship-like, feelings towards men were getting in the way of me worshiping and following Christ wholeheartedly.

"I was bitter and lost for most of my early 20's but I am now studying the Scriptures, discipling people, and following Christ in a new church. I am writing to say thanks!"

The solution to this problem is not to abandon church or to capitulate to a contemporary style of Christianity that is conformed to the world. The "newest" part of the true Christian faith is 2,000 years old; it simply is *not* going to be contemporary cool! Biblical Christianity is pilgrim Christianity and it is hated by this world.

When I was saved in 1973 out of a "hippie" background, I was perfectly cool by the world's standards. I was a real "dude." I had my long hair; had my self-centered attitude and my New Age smorgasbord philosophy; had my sensual party music; had my drug-using, hitchhiking background. But after my conversion I didn't search for a cool type of Christianity. I had truly repented of my foolish ways and my rebellion against God. I was fed up with it. I wanted something different: something eternal rather than temporal, solid rather than shallow, unbending rather than plastic, holy rather than worldly.

When I was confronted with cool Christianity in the form of the Jesus Movement in the 1970s, I was confused by it at first, then I was offended by it. That is what God saved me OUT OF! Why should God's people want to conform themselves to the plastic pop culture? Why should they want to conform to the world's music and appearance and drink deeply of its entertainment? The Bible is very plain that you cannot have the world and Christ, too. This world is at enmity with the holy God and His Christ, and the friend of this world is the enemy of God. And the Western pop culture is the most powerful and effective form of the "world" that has ever come down the pike. See the warnings of Romans 12:2; Ephesians 5:11; James 1:27; 4:4; 1 John 2:15-17.

Many who reject "fundamentalist" type churches as being too strict and hypocritical end up straining at gnats and

swallowing camels (Mat. 23:24). I mean that while they claim to see all of the real and perceived errors of "fundamentalists," they overlook even worse errors in the contemporary crowd.

The church is God's plan. Jesus said, "I will build my church" (Mat. 16:18). He said to the first disciples that He would be with His people to the end of the age as we seek to fulfill the Great Commission (Mat. 28:18-20).

We should reject unscriptural churches, but we must not reject the church as God's holy institution.

Further, the solution is not to abandon "fundamentalism," which I am referring to merely in the sense of practicing separatism and being strict in one's approach to doctrine and practice. "Fundamentalism" in this sense is not the problem.

(I reject "fundamentalism" as a movement as being contrary to Scripture due particularly to its transdenominational character, its "in essentials unity, in non-essentials liberty" heresy, and its "universal church" mentality. When I speak of holding to "fundamentalism" I am using the term as a synonym for biblical separatism. See the report "The Insufficiency and Error of Fundamentalism" and the free eBook <u>New Evangelicalism: Its History, Characteristics and Fruit</u> at the Way of Life web site -- <u>www.wayoflife.org.</u>)

God's Word demands separation from error and worldliness (e.g., Romans 12:2; 16:17; 2 Corinthians

6:17; Ephesians 5:11; Philippians 3:17-18; Colossians 2:8; 1 Timothy 6:3-5; 2 Timothy 2:16-18; 3:5; James 1:27; 4:4; 1 John 2:15-17).

Separatism is not an optional part of Christianity. It is biblical and it is right and it is pleasing to God.

God's Word demands strictness in the matter of doctrinal purity (e.g. Acts 20:27-28; Ephesians 4:14; 1 Timothy 1:3; 2 Timothy 2:2; Titus 1:9) and holy living (e.g. 2 Corinthians 7:1; Titus 2:11-14; 1 Peter 2:11).

Just because some have practiced "fundamentalism" hypocritically and shallowly does not mean that it is wrong at its essence.

We must exercise great patience and mercy because every church has failings. Yea, we all have failings, so it would be hypocritical to demand perfection of others. We must find the wise, spiritually-mature balance of being patient with those sins, compromises, and errors of a sort that will always be a factor in a Bible-believing church, while not ignoring the sins, compromises, and errors that render the church incapable of fulfilling its God-given task. We must learn when to stay and when to leave, when to submit and when to separate, and only the Spirit of God can grant such wisdom.

The solution to the problem we discuss in this report [referring to the book *The Hyles Effect*] is to move beyond criticizing error and to strive to do something right, as we have discussed in the chapter "Not Enough to Criticize."



The teaching of Ephesians 4-6 refutes the popular philosophy of "cultural liberalism."

• "Cultural liberalism" is the idea that the grace of Christ liberates the believer to relax and enjoy the worldly pop culture: rock and roll, R-rated movies, sensual video games, pro sports and all of its sin and filth, pop fashion, tattooing, drinking, perhaps even marijuana.

Scott Thomas, director of the Acts 29 evangelical church planting network, says, "We won't attack the culture in the name of Christianity." Evangelicals mockingly call the separatist stance the "Christian ghetto" or "fortress mentality." Mark Driscoll claims to be "theologically conservative and culturally liberal" ("Pastor Provocateur," Christianity Today, Sept. 21, 2007). He criticizes "hardcore fundamentalism that throws rocks at culture" (Ibid.). He defines himself as "relevant," "contextual," and "cool" ("Conference examines the emerging church," Baptist Press, Sept. 25, 2007). This philosophy permeates evangelical Christianity. It is the philosophy of Wheaton College and Moody Bible Institute and Biola and Crue (Campus Crusade for Christ) and Christianity Today and Zondervan and InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, etc. Books that promote this philosophy include The Grace Awakening by Chuck Swindoll, Blue Like Jazz by Donald Miller, The Radical Reformission by Mark Driscoll, They Like Jesus But Not the Church by Dan Kimball, and The Barbarian Way by Erwin McManus.

• A video clip at McManus' Mosaic web site is a dance sequence set to funky music "where these cool dancers come out on stage and they are beset by these ominous people in suits. In the end the cool people overcome the suit people, who lose their suits and become like the cool people. Message: Don't be a suit--be cool." (Brian Snider's description after watching the video on November 26, 2007.)

The meaning of this video, of course, is that professing Christians should "loosen up" and not be so uptight and restrictive about how they dress and how they live.

- This is a brazen attack against the biblical position of separation from the world.
- It is a great enticement to young believers.
- It is a great danger to the biblical Christian life and true spiritual victory.

### Consider some major lessons from Ephesians 5:10-17:

A circumspect Christian life requires a testing mindset ("Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord, Eph. 5:9-10).

- "*Proving*" (Eph. 5:10) is *dokimázo*, "to try, discern, distinguish, approve" (*Complete Word Study Bible*). It is also translated "discern" (Lu. 12:56), "examine" (1 Co. 11:28), and "try" (1 Jo. 4:1).
- (1) This is the testing mindset that is an essential part of the Christian life and ministry. Compare Ac. 17:11; Ro. 12:2; 2 Co. 10:5; Php. 1:10; 1 Th. 5:21; Heb. 5:14. This is the path of spiritual safety. It is the path of God's will.
- (2) The testing mindset requires a strong knowledge of Scripture. This is the subject of Hebrews 5:12-14. There must be skill in the use of Scripture. There must be the ability to take the strong meat and not just milk. There must be the exercise of the spiritual senses "to discern both good and evil."
- (3) Everything in the Christian life is to be tested as to whether it is "acceptable unto the Lord" (Eph. 5:10). This is the only thing that matters in the Christian life. It does not matter if something is acceptable in the eyes of men. It must be acceptable to the Lord. The essential question is, "Does this thing please the Lord, my Master?"
- (4) Everything is to be tested by whether it is light or darkness (Eph. 5:8). If it is of darkness, it is to be rejected, avoided, and reproved.

- (5) Everything is to be tested by the fruit of the Spirit ("For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth," Eph. 5:9). The standard for defining goodness, righteousness, and truth is Holy Scripture. Everything must be tested by Scripture. If something is contrary to God's Word, it is not good, not righteous, and not truth, no matter what man thinks about it. If it is contrary to God's Word, it is the doctrine of devils and not of the Spirit of God. The better God's people know the Word of God, the better they can discern goodness, righteousness, and truth.
- "Proving" is present tense, indicating continuous, persistent action. The proving is to be the believer's way of life. The biblical worldview teaches me that I live in a fallen world filled with spiritual, moral, and doctrinal danger, and I must be ever vigilant to protect myself and others, ever testing.

### A circumspect Christian life requires having "no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness" (Eph. 5:11).

- Again we see that this is a very strict path. "No fellowship with" is the highest standard of separation. It is contrary to the philosophy that prevails among professing Christians today, which is "lighten up, don't be so strict, don't be so demanding, don't be judgmental."
- "Fellowship" is sugkoinonéo, to participate with, to take part in, to partner with, to share together. It is translated "communicate with" (Php. 4:14) and "be partakers of" (Re. 18:4). "The word refers to a joint-participation between two or more individuals in a common interest and a common activity" (Kenneth Wuest).
- "Works of darkness" refer to every deed that is contrary to God's moral law. The works of darkness are the works of sin, evil, unrighteousness, unholiness, impurity. They are called "darkness" because they are of the darkness of this fallen world and the darkness of the devil.

### A circumspect Christian life requires that we "**reprove**" the unfruitful works of darkness (Eph. 5:11-14).

- "Reprove" is *elégcho*, "to convince of error, refute, confute." It is translated "tell him his fault" (Mt. 18:15), "convince of sin" (Joh. 8:46), and "rebuke" (1 Ti. 5:20; Tit. 1:13; Re. 3:19). It is "to reprove or rebuke so as to bring out conviction or confession of guilt" (Wuest). It is to "convict by turning the light on the darkness" (*Robertson's Word Pictures*).
- This is the aggressive part of biblical separation. To reprove the works of darkness is to shine light upon those works so that men and women can know that they are sinners before God and that God is a holy judge. "*Rather*' means that the obligation of administering reproof is not to be reluctantly

- added to that of avoiding fellowship but to be added with zest. That is what the light is for: not just to shine for itself but 'rather' also to blaze out into the darkness and to expose what that darkness covers up' (Robert Lenski).
- Reproving the unfruitful works of darkness is a necessary part of the gospel ministry, as we see in Romans 1-3. Paul spent more than two chapters reproving sin, showing man's guilt before God, revealing God's judgment. Only then did he preach the grace of Christ (Ro. 3:21-24). This is the right way to preach the gospel. Man must know that he is a lost, undone sinner before he will flee to Christ for salvation. To reprove the works of darkness is to use the law for its rightful purpose which is to be a schoolmaster to lead men to Christ (Gal. 3:24).
- Reproving the unfruitful works of darkness is a necessary part of preaching and teaching God's Word ("reprove, rebuke," 2 Ti. 4:2). The Word of God is profitable "for reproof, for correction" (2 Ti. 3:17). The right kind of preaching is an essential part of maintaining spiritual revival in a church.

### A circumspect Christian life requires living circumspectly ("See then that ye walk circumspectly," Eph. 5:15).


- "See" is blépo, which is translated "take heed" (1 Co. 8:9; 10:12), "beware" (Php. 3:2; Col. 2:8), and "look to" (2 Jo. 1:8). It "expresses an intent, earnest contemplation" (Vine). It means to pay attention to something, to see that you do it, to take heed to it.
- "Circumspectly" is akribós, "exactly, accurately, carefully" (Vine). It is also translated "diligently" (Mt. 2:8; Ac. 18:25) and "perfect" (Lu. 1:3). To walk circumspectly is to be careful to please the Lord in every way and to avoid sin and error. It is to pay close attention to living according to God's will as expressed in Scripture. It is to measure everything by God's Word.
- To walk circumspectly is to act "not as fools, but as wise." To walk circumspectly is to refuse to act foolishly. Before salvation, the individual can only act as a fool by God's measure, because his understanding is darkened and his heart is blind (Eph. 4:18). But the believer has been made alive, has the new man, and has been enlightened by God's Spirit. He can therefore walk as wise, but this doesn't come automatically. To walk as wise is a choice that he or she must make. I recall as a new believer at age 23, when I began reading the book of Proverbs, I saw that though saved I had many of the characteristics of the fool, and I earnestly wanted to be wise rather than foolish. I had known the Bible since childhood, but I had never cared about being wise until I was saved.
- To walk circumspectly requires "*redeeming the time*" (Eph. 5:16).
- (1) "Redeem" is to buy, to purchase. Time is valuable. To redeem time is to use it wisely in God's will. When a day is

gone, it is gone forever. It has been said, "Time is money." Every day, and every hour of the day, is a wonderful opportunity that God gives to His redeemed, and it must be used wisely. "This is the day which the LORD hath made..." (Ps. 118:24).

- (2) Time can be redeemed because of salvation. Because I have been reconciled to God and have been made accepted in the beloved, I can serve God and please Him and do His will. God gives men a choice about how to spend time on this earth.
- (3) To redeem the time is to do those things found in the context of this exhortation (Eph. 5:10-19). It is to use one's time to serve Christ and do God's will. It is to have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, to walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, to understand the will of the Lord, to be not drunk with wine, to be filled with the Spirit, to speak to yourselves in spiritual songs.
- (4) Redeeming the time requires seeing each season of life as a unique opportunity to do God's will. God divided man's earthly life into seasons. There is childhood, youth, adulthood,

old age. Each season is addressed in Scripture. The child is to learn discipline, to be educated in God's Word, to be prepared for salvation and God's service (e.g., De. 6:4-7; Pr. 22:6, 15; 29:15 Eph. 6:1-4). God's Word addresses youth (e.g., Ec. 12:1; Tit. 2:4-6) and the elderly (e.g., Tit. 2:2-3). To redeem the time is to give my full attention to doing God's will in the season of life in which I find myself.

(5) Redeeming the time is to do what is acceptable to the Lord (Eph. 5:10). To redeem the time is to use my time to the best advantage to accomplish God's will. It is to make a plan for my daily life so that I do God's will and I don't spend my days in vanity and worldliness. If God has plainly stated something in Scripture, I must do it and by doing it I am redeeming the time. For example, He has said not to forsake the assembly (Heb. 10:25). Therefore, I redeem the time by making the assembly a priority. God has said that I am to be a skillful student of Scripture (Heb. 5:12-13). Therefore, I must make Bible reading and study and meditation a priority in my daily schedule. God has said that the father is to be the spiritual head of the family and the mother is to be the keeper of the home, so the father and mother must make this a priority in their daily schedules.



within Christianity. Unity is the cry of the times. There is a call to "break down the walls." The ecumenical principle and spirit is gaining predominance everywhere, but it is a rebellious spirit that is contrary to the Bible.

### First, the ecumenical movement has an unscriptural view of doctrine.

The term "doctrine" appears fifty-six times in the English Bible. The first characteristic of the church at Jerusalem was that it "continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine" (Ac. 2:42). The one true faith, the one true body of doctrinal truth, was given to the apostles and prophets by

divine inspiration and enshrined in the New Testament Scripture. The doctrine was inscribed, canonized, and preserved. It was "once delivered unto the saints" (Jude 1:3). The completed faith was sealed with a sharp warning in the last chapter (Re. 22:18-19). From that time, churches are to keep that same doctrine. They are to contend for it (Jude 1:3).

Paul taught Timothy to care deeply about sound doctrine. In 1 Timothy, Paul mentioned doctrine and teaching 18 times. He began the epistle by exhorting Timothy not to allow *any* other doctrine (1 Ti. 1:3). That is the strictest position possible. Timothy was to give attendance to doctrine (1 Ti. 4:13). He was to take heed unto the

doctrine and continue in it (1 Ti. 4:16). He was to separate on the basis of doctrine (1 Ti. 6:3-5). He was to keep the doctrine without spot (1 Ti. 6:20).

Most divisions between Christians are doctrinal. Why is an Episcopalian church different from a Baptist church? The doctrine is different. Consider the doctrine of baptism. One denomination teaches that baptism is the new birth; the other, that baptism is symbolic. ("In the waters of baptism, we are lovingly adopted by God into God's family, which we call the Church, and given God's own life" (episcopalchurch.org). One baptizes infants; the other baptizes believers only. ("The infant is being cleansed of original sin," *The Episcopal Dictionary*). One pours; the other immerses.

One of the names of the Spirit of God is "the Spirit of Truth" (Joh. 14:17; 15:26; 16:13; 1 Jo. 4:6). When the Spirit comes in His saving and sanctifying power, He always comes with Truth. He never teaches heresy.

It is impossible to take the Bible's instruction about doctrine seriously and also be ecumenical.

### Second, the ecumenical movement ignores the Bible's warnings about apostasy.

Christ and the apostles taught that false Christianity will increase throughout the church age and will reign everywhere at the end of the age. Those who preach ecumenical unity ignore this truth. They don't warn about apostasy. They don't identify apostasy.

- Apostasy is prophesied in Christ's parables of the mysteries of the kingdom (Mt. 13:10-11, 24-25, 33). These parables teach that the devil will sow false Christianity into the world, and it will increase like leaven "till the whole was leavened." This means false Christianity will grow throughout the centuries; it will spread throughout the earth; and it will be the predominate form of Christianity.
- Apostasy is prophesied by Paul in his final epistle (2 Ti. 3:1-13; 4:3-4). This great prophecy describes false Christianity. It will be characterized by love of self (2 Ti. 3:2). It will have a form of godliness, but deny the power thereof (2 Ti. 3:5). This means it will not have the power of the new birth and the infallible Scripture. It will grow throughout the centuries (2 Ti. 3:13). It will be deceptive (2 Ti. 3:13). It will not endure sound doctrine (2 Ti. 4:3). It will preach liberty to live after one's own lusts (2 Ti. 4:3). It will be preached by "heaps" of false teachers who will give the people the kind of Christianity they want (2 Ti. 4:3). It will have fables (2 Ti.

4:4). False Christianity is filled with fables such as Mary the Queen of Heaven, transubstantiation (the host of the mass becomes Jesus), the pope having the keys of Peter, purgatory, the intercession of the saints, evolution, the book of Mormon, two Isaiahs, and the word-faith heresy.

• Apostasy is also prophesied in Acts 20:28-30; 1 Ti. 4:1-3; 2 Pe. 2:1-2; 1 Jo. 2:18; 4:1-2.

### Third, the ecumenical movement is disobedience to the Bible's command of separation.

God forbids fellowship with error. A truly Spirit-filled Christian will obey the Spirit's instruction about separation and contending for the faith.

See Ro. 16:17; 2 Co. 6:14; 11:3-4; Eph. 4:14; Php. 3:1-2; Col. 2:8; 2 Th. 3:6; 2 Ti. 2:16-18; 2 Ti. 2:16-18; 3:5, 13-14; Tit. 1:10-11; 2 Jo. 1:7-11; Jude 1:3

If we obey the Bible's commands about keeping sound doctrine and separating from false doctrine, it is impossible to participate in ecumenical unity.

### What about Christian unity?

1. True Christian unity is practiced in a sound New Testament church in which the members are united together in one mind to serve Jesus Christ and to fulfill the Great Commission. This is the context of the major passages on unity.

See Romans 15:5-6; 1 Corinthians 1:10; 2 Corinthians 13:11; Philippians 1:27.

2. John 17:21 does not teach ecumenical unity.

This is the main proof text for ecumenical unity, but it is taken out of context and misinterpreted.

John 17 is not a command that Christians are to obey; it is a prayer that Jesus addressed to the Father. It is not something man needs to do; it is something God has already done. It is a prayer, and the prayer was answered. The unity described in John 17 is a supernatural thing that only God could do (Joh. 17:21-24). Born again believers are one with God; they share in Christ's glory.

In John 17 is not something pertaining to all professing Christians. Christ prays only for the following:

- those who have received His Word and have believed for sure in Jesus the Christ (Joh. 17:8). These are Christians who understand the true gospel and have a know-so salvation testimony.
- those who have kept His Word (Joh. 17:6). These are obedient Bible Christians. They do not live according to their own lusts (2 Ti. 4:3-4).
- those who are not of the world but are hated by the world (Joh. 17:14, 16). These are Christians who live a separated pilgrim lifestyle; they do not love the world; they are not friends of the world.
- those who are sanctified by the word of truth (Joh. 17:17). These are Bible Christians who accept the Bible as the word of truth.

John 17 does not describe end-time Christianity with its countless heresies and fables.

This is not the Roman Catholic Church. This is not the World Council of Churches with its 350 denominations representing more than 500 million professing Christians. This is not "evangelicalism."


True Christian unity is a unity in truth and obedience to the Scripture. It is a unity of born again, Bible-believing Christians. It is the unity of a sound New Testament church. It is not a unity that ignores doctrinal differences for the sake of an enlarged fellowship. It is unity in truth, not "unity in diversity." It is a narrow unity, not a large unity.

### AND THE GREAT APOSTASY

The emerging church is a magnet for those who have rejected the "old-fashioned" New Testament faith and who despise traditional Bible-believing churches, dogmatic biblical preaching, and biblical "judgmentalism" in regard to lifestyle choices.

Many of the books I have read by emerging leaders make this admission.

For example, in Blue Like Jazz Donald Miller tells how that he refused to be restricted by the teaching of traditional-type churches. He wanted to drink beer and watch raunchy movies and talk trashy and run around with atheists and other rebels. In discussing his involvement in church in his youth he says, "I wished I could have subscribed to aspects of Christianity but not the whole thing" (p. 30). He complains, "In order to believe Christianity, you either had to reduce enormous theological absurdities [i.e., Garden of Eden, universal flood] into children's stories or ignore them" (p. 31). He wanted to believe the gospel "free from the clasp of fairy tale" (p. 35). In other words, he wanted to pick and choose what parts of the Bible he would believe. He despised dogmatic Bible preaching and hated it when preachers "said we had to follow Jesus" because "sometimes they would make Him sound angry" (p. 34).

In fact, Jesus was angry sometimes even in His incarnation ("he looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts," Mark 3:5), and He will be very angry in the future when the wrath of the Lamb is poured out upon mankind as

described in the book of Revelation and many other places in Scripture!

When Miller decided to attend a raunchy secular college in Portland, Oregon, where most of the students are atheists and agnostics and they use drugs and openly fornicate and sometimes run around naked, a Christian friend sat him down and warned him that God did not want him to attend there. That was good biblical advice (e.g., 2 Corinthians 6:14-17; Ephesians 5:11; 2 Timothy 3:5; James 4:4; 1 John 2:15-17), but Miller ignored the warning and felt that the wicked atmosphere was a liberating experience. He writes: "The first day of school was exhilarating. It was better than high school. Reed had ashtrays, and everybody said cusswords" (p. 38). After spending time with drug-using, atheistic hippies who lived in the woods he said, "I had discovered life outside the church, and I liked it. As I said, I preferred it" (p. 210).

At a book signing event, one enthusiastic reader of Miller's *Blue Like Jazz* said: "I love *Blue Like Jazz* because it's, like, a Christian book, but it doesn't make you feel bad about yourself" ("A Better Storyteller," *Christianity Today*, June 2007). Another said: "I've already bought *Blue Like Jazz* 13 times. But I gotta have all these to give to people. I'm a Jesus girl, but I also like to go out and do tequila shots with my friends. This is a book I can give to those friends."

Some members of Spirit Garage meet in an Irish bar in downtown Minneapolis on Wednesday for a weekly Theology Pub, a mix of biblical discussion and beer. Lindsey Gice, a member of Spirit Garage, says that when the subject of Christianity comes up, "I always feel like I have to qualify it, like, 'I'm not that kind of Christian, I go to a cool church" ("Hip New Churches Pray to a Different Drummer," *New York Times*, Feb.

18, 2004). Gice said that she left church after high school because her former churches were "way too judgmental."

Brian McLaren's book A New Kind of Christian is the story of a pastor who rejects the Bible in a "crisis of faith" and follows the guidance of a modernist. The book recounts the man's journey from a fairly solid faith in the Bible as the absolute standard for truth, in which doctrine is either right or wrong, scriptural or unscriptural, to a pliable, philosophical position in which "faith is more about a way of life than a system of belief, where being authentically good is more important than being doctrinally right" (from the back cover of A New Kind of Christian).

In A Renegade's Guide to God, David Foster mocks "Bible thumpers" and calls for a "renegade" type of Christianity that "resists being named, revolts at being shamed, and rebels against being tamed" (p. 8). He says, "We won't be 'told' what to do or 'commanded' how to behave" (p. 10).

Nanette Sawyer, in her chapter in An Emergent Manifesto of Hope, begins by describing her "explicit rejection of Christianity" (p. 43). She rejected the division of people into categories of saved and unsaved. She rejected the restriction on women church leaders. She renounced the doctrine that man is "inherently bad" and the necessity of judging oneself a sinner. She complains, "This didn't leave any room for questions, doubts, or growth in faith."

The testimony of Anna Dodridge of Bournemouth, England, is featured in the book *Emerging Churches* by Eddie Gibbs and Ryan Bolger. She describes how that she grew up in a Christian home but fell in love with the world and got deeply involved in the club culture, which involves all night dance and drug parties. Her interests were "in drinking and kissing boys" (p. 262). She got fed up with the churches because they "refused to support me" and "couldn't see how I could possibly want to go into nightclubs, and they thought it was disgraceful that we were encouraging the culture." As a result, she "went off to Ibiza, Spain (a magnet for clubbers from all over Europe) for a couple of weeks." She and others that support the emerging church philosophy are "fed up with traditional church, heavy-handed guidance" (p. 264).

The membership of the emerging church congregation called Revive in Leeds, England, is "mainly made up of people who didn't fit into 'regular' church. They were too

cynical, too rebellious, too radical" (*Emerging Church*, p. 273).

Jonny Baker of Grace in London, England, says: "We once did a service called 'we're right, follow us' that explored the discomfort we all feel with that old-school, arrogant approach to evangelism" (*Emerging Church*, p. 123).

Donald McCullough complains about those who make "cocksure pronouncements about God" and engage in "doctrinal warfare" and are "eager to condemn others to hell" (If Grace Is So Amazing, Why Don't We Like It, p. 25). He is opposed to preachers who "crack the whip of the imperative ('Do this!') [rather] than announce the news of the indicative ('God has done this!')" (p. 78). He doesn't like the type of preaching that says, "... don't do that, curb your appetites, reign in desire, discipline and sacrifice yourself" (p. 104). He claims that grace means "we may relax in our humanity" (p. 141).

These people are rebels against the plain teaching of the Bible, and as a magnet for rebellion the emerging church holds a wide attraction in these last days as prophesied in Scripture:

"For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; and they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables" (2 Timothy 4:3-4).

This prophecy describes a great turning away from the truth among professing Christians. It says they will reject the sound teaching of the Bible and desire a new type of Christianity that allows them to live after their own lusts. That is a strange type of Christianity, but we are seeing its fulfillment before our very eyes. The prophecy says there will be heaps of teachers who will give the people this new type of Christianity, and this is exactly what we see. Christian bookstores are filled with books and the Internet is filled with Christian articles and blogs, but the majority of this material does not contain the straightforward preaching of God's Word that reproves, rebukes, and exhorts (2 Timothy 4:2). Rather, they are filled with doctrine that scratches the itching ears of those who have rejected the Bible. They are filled with pop novelties, psychology, self-esteemism, pampering of the ego, friendship with the world, heresies, questionings, boastings, doubtings, illicit fellowship

with error (e.g., evangelicals and contemplative spirituality), railings against "legalism" falsely so called, fairy tales, fictional romance, reconstructed history, fascination with ancient heretics wrongly called "church fathers," and many other such things.

The New Evangelicalism of the 1950s was a rebellion against strict biblical Christianity, and the emerging church is simply a step further in that fearful direction.

Rebellion is a natural product of our fallen nature. The Old Man, as it is called in Scripture, which we inherited from Adam's fall, is at enmity against God and His Word. True Christianity requires a new birth. There are no "second generation" Christians in the true biblical sense. Thus each person that grows up in a Christian home and church must come to grips with the gospel for himself and herself, and because the devil and the indwelling fallen nature are real, there is a spiritual battle that must be waged. I faced this battle in my youth. I grew up in a Bible-believing church and went through the motions of

receiving Christ and joining the church, but I wanted my own way more than Christ's. I rejected the Bible, left the church, and went very far into the world before being converted at age 23. Emerging church philosophy would doubtless have been appealing to me in my unsaved, rebellious condition.

Because of this ongoing battle that rages with each new generation, the rebellion that is part and parcel of the emerging church philosophy is very enticing to a wide range of people.

The emerging church is a fulfillment of the prophecy of 2 Timothy 4:2-4.

"Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away *their* ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables."

Third Reich dictator Adolph Hitler had a little-known plan to destroy the Jews in Palestine.

Beginning in the 1930s, Hitler began communicating with Palestinian leaders to forge an alliance against the cause of a Jewish homeland.

In 1937, the German Consulate in Palestine stated in a report, "The formation of a Jewish state ... is not in Germany's interest because a [Jewish] Palestinian state would create additional national power bases for international Jewry..."

In July 1938, Nazi agent Adam Vollhardt was sent to Palestine for face-to-face meetings with Arab leaders.

There were also personal meetings of **Haj Amin al-Husseini** (the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem) with Hitler and Adolf Heinrich Himmler. Hitler told Husseini,

"Germany's objective ... [is] solely the destruction of the Jewish element residing in the Arab sphere" ("The Holocaust: The Mufti and the Fuhrer," *Jewish Virtual Library*).

Husseini was the instigator of murderous rampages against Jews in Palestine. He spent most of World War II in Germany broadcasting Nazi anti-Jewish propaganda to the Middle East, including calls for the destruction of Jewish settlements. On March 1, 1944, Husseini stated on a Berlin radio Arabic broadcast,

"Arabs! Rise as one and fight for your sacred rights. Kill the Jews wherever you find them. This pleases Allah, history and religion. This serves your honor, Allah is with you" (Jeffrey Herf, *Nazi Propaganda for the Arab World*, p. 213).

Husseini lived in a luxurious villa at Nazi expense and received a massive 90,000 Reichmarks monthly stipend, at a time when only 17 percent of Germans had *annual* incomes of 2,400 Richmarks or more ("Haj Amin al-Husseini," Jerusalem Center for Public Affairs, Jan. 5, 2016).

Concrete plans were laid for the Nazis and Arabs to work together toward the extermination of the Palestine Jews.

Hitler's Afrika Corps entered North Africa in February 1941 with the objective to destroy the British army in Libya and Egypt. Under the leadership of the brilliant Erwin Rommel (called "the Desert Fox"), the British were pushed farther and farther east.

At the time, the German forces appeared invincible. They occupied western Europe and appeared to be on the verge of defeating Stalin in Russia.

In the event of defeat in Egypt, the British planned to take a final stand in Iraq to protect their oil fields, which were essential for the war effort. That would have left Palestine open for the Germans.

In expectation of a victory by the Africa Corps over British forces, German units were assigned to the Corps to join the Arabs in exterminating Jews as soon as the way was open. These units were Einsatzkommando mobile killing squads (composed of SS and Gestapo) and SD (Sicherheitsdienst, the intelligence agency of the SS), the primary Nazi agents tasked with exterminating the Jews in Hitler's "Final Solution." The units assigned to the Afrika Corps were trained in Greece by SD officer Walter

Rauff, the originator of the gassing van experiments in Poland.

"The culmination of these plans came in the summer of 1942, when the extermination of the Jews that had begun in Europe was to be expanded to the Yishuv [Jewish settlement in Palestine] as well, with the active assistance of local Arab collaborators" (Klaus-Michael Mallmann, Nazi Palestine: The Plans for the Extermination of the Jews in Palestine, p. viiii).

The Jewish Haganah was aware of what was happening and planned to move the Jews of Palestine to a base on Mount Carmel in a last ditch effort against the Germans and Arabs. They said, "If we are destined to fall, let us fall here ... the Hebrew flag in the Land of Israel will be worthless if the Jews of Palestine do not rise up in a last heroic attempt to defend it" (Yitzhak Tabenkin, cited from "The Nazi invasion of Palestine, 1942," *The Times of Israel*, Apr. 19, 2015).


The "Carmel Plan" to relocate a half million Jews from various parts of "Palestine" to the mountain and build defensive systems was prepared in detail by Yitzhak Sadeh, commander of the Haganah, and Yochanan Ratner of the Technion University. There were to be air strips,

agriculture, cave redoubts, etc. They planned for supplies to be air dropped by the Allies. They even trained a squad of German-speaking Jews with "Aryan looks" who would infiltrate, gather intelligence, and kill German troops.

But by the end of 1942, the war was unexpectedly going against the Germans on both fronts. In Russia, the battle of Stalingrad began to turn in Russia's favor. In Africa, the British and Americans gained the ascendency over Rommel's forces. In November 1942, the Nazis suffered a major defeat at the Second Battle of El Alamein in Egypt that turned the tide of the war in Africa. In May 1943, the Afrika Corps surrendered.

This was the end of Hitler's dream of liquidating the Jews of Palestine.

After El Alamein, Walter Rauff shifted his Einstazkommando killing units to Tunisia. He was joined by Oswald Pohl, who had organized the concentration camps in Eastern Europe. Many Jews were murdered and died in labor camps in Tunisia, but the work of the German killing squads was cut short when the Afrika Corps surrendered to Allied forces.



THE JELLY FISH THAT SAILS AGAINST THE WIND (Friday Church News Notes, October 17, 2025, www.wayoflife.org fbns@wayoflife.org, 866-295-4143) - The following is from CreationMoments.com, Sept. 22, 2025: "Do you know how to handle a sailboat? If you had to sail to a destination that was not exactly downwind, would you be able to do it? Unlike most jellyfish, velella does not merely drift with the wind. Velella has a triangular sail. [This is called a latine sail on ships; it was invented by man in the 15th century at the dawn of the Age of Discovery.] However, unlike some jellyfish with sails, velella's sail doesn't simply catch the wind and move velella along with it. Velella's triangular sail has an S-shaped base so that it can stand up to winds from any direction. The sail is set on top of velella's body at an angle to its length. This makes velella a biological oddity--because its body is not symmetrical. This asymmetry is not without purpose. The unusual body design of this jellyfish allows it to sail as much as 60 degrees off the direction of the wind. This is what sailors call a broad reach. Some velellas have their sails tilted to the right. allowing them to sail up to 60 degrees to the right of downwind. Others have their sails tilted to the left, allowing them to sail up to 60 degrees left of downwind. What's more, velellas can change their angle of sailing by extending or retracting their tentacles in the water. When scientists noticed that velella's body was asymmetrical,



they immediately looked for a purpose behind the design. Even though many scientists will not recognize the Creator, they understand enough to realize that nothing in the creation is without purpose or design. So while many deny the Creator, they still recognize the pattern of His handiwork! Ref: 'The by-the-wind sailor: a masterpiece of natural design.' Discover. Velella, Wilson44691, CC0, Wikimedia Commons."

#### DIGGING IN THE WALLS

God commanded the prophet Ezekiel to dig in the walls of Israel's temple and observe the evils being done in secret by apostate religious leaders of that day. "Then said he unto me, Son of man, dig now in the wall ... And he said unto me, Go in, and behold the wicked abominations that they do here. So I went in and saw. ..." (Ezek. 8:7-10).

Ezekiel was then instructed to preach against the errors of the leaders and to tell the people the things he had witnessed.

"Therefore prophesy against them, prophesy, O son of man. ... Then I spake unto them of the captivity all the things that the Lord had shewed me" (Ezek. 11:4,25).

The hour in which we live is very similar to that of Ezekiel's day. Many of those who profess to be the people of God are apostate. It was prophesied in the New Testament Scriptures that such would be the case in the closing hours of our age. This will culminate in the brief worldwide rule of an utterly apostate Harlot "church" (2 Tim. 3-4; 1 Tim. 4; 2 Pet. 2-3; Jude; Rev. 17).

As in Ezekiel's day much of the apostasy of our hour is hidden from the view of the average Christian. We intend by God's grace to "dig in the walls" of modern ecumenism and to expose and cry out against the things we find. In this section we also report on secular events which are relevant to Christians. May God give us ears to hear, minds to understand, and hearts to obey. Is the truth of God not worthy of defense?

Mr. Trump boasts of his deal making ability and wants a Nobel Prize for Peace, but he doesn't have the power to bring peace to the Middle East or to the world in general. God's Word tells us exactly what is going to happen. 

I lose it" ("Megachurch Pastor Ed Young," The Christian Post, Oct. 3, 2025). Young is the oldest son of Homer Edwin Young, pastor of megachurch Second Baptist of Houston, Texas, author of many books, and former president of the Southern Baptist Convention (1992 and 1993). It was reported in 2010 that Ed Young has a private jet, an annual salary of \$1 million, and a housing allowance of \$240,000 ("Prominent Grapevine pastor linked to luxury," WFAA-TV, Feb. 5, 2010). For our part, the length of a sermon depends on the occasion and the quality of the preaching. Some occasions call for short sermons, and many preachers should limit their sermons to 5 or 10 minutes on all occasions. For others, an hour can be too short. Consider Lawrence Chaderton, one of the translators of the King James Bible. As a young man Chaderton began a



series of afternoon sermons at the St. church of Clement's. Cambridge, that continued for 50 years. "Sermons were timed by an hour glass, which stood beside the pulpit. Chaderton's biographer tells how once having preached for two hours, he feared he had worn out his listeners' patience and stopped. But the entire congregation cried, 'Go on! We beg you, go on!' Chaderton continued for another hour" (Olga Opfell, The King James Bible Translators, p. 47). When he announced that he was retiring from these lectures, forty of the clergy, they owed said conversion to his preaching, begged him to reconsider. There are very few preachers of this caliber. It has been well said that the preacher should quit when the audience would have him continue rather than long for him to stop.

Sadly, the President doesn't know what he is talking about. Any Middle East peace program is an ignorant pipe dream that flies in the face of the holy Bible's clear teaching. Twice God said through the prophet Isaiah, "There is no peace unto the wicked" (Isa. 48:22; 57:21). They have blood on their hands and expertise in their heads. ... Every released prisoner returns to Gaza or Judea and Samaria as a hero, a symbol of resistance, armed with years of additional training and burning with renewed purpose.
