JASON ALDEAN'S COUNTRY ROCK PHILOSOPHY

In recent weeks, Jason Aldean has been in the media spotlight for his song "Try That in a Small Town," which stirred up opposition by the "woke" crowd. He is a typical country rocker, which is a fundamental part of America's problem, not the solution. Aldean's filthy songs make a mockery of God's holy laws and encourage people to live as they please and thumb their noses at God's Word. Consider the song "Church Pew or Barstool." 

helpful. The event description said, "Demons have a bad reputation, but maybe we're just not very good at getting to know them." But the name "Lilit" ("Lilith") is that of a filthy "demon of the night" from

ANOTHER CCM ARTIST COMES OUT FOR HOMOSEXUALITY

"Boys Will Be Girls" is the title of a new song and video by Derek Webb supporting transsexual drag queens. Webb is the former lead singer of the popular CCM band Caedmon's Call. "Boys Will Be Girls" presents transsexualism as an innocent thing that Jesus would support. Not surprisingly, Christians who oppose homosexuality are treated as misguided, mean-spirited, dangerous Pharisees. Webb is the latest in a long list of artists associated with contemporary worship music who have come out as homosexuals or in support of homosexuality. It is nothing new. In 1998, CCM star Kirk Franklin said that "homosexuality ... is a problem today in gospel music--a MAJOR CONCERN--and everybody knows it" (Church Boy, pp. 49, 50). In 2010, Douglas Harrison said, "... you can't swing a Dove Award without hitting upon evidence of the longstanding, deep-set presence of queer experience in, and its influence on, Christian music culture at all levels" ("Come Out from among Them," Religion Dispatches, April 30, 2010). James Cleveland, the "King of Gospel," was a homosexual who died of AIDS. Marsha Stevens, author of "For Those Tears I Died" and co-founder of Children of the Day, one of the first contemporary Christian music groups, left her husband, "married" a woman, and started her own label called BALM (Born Again Lesbian Music). In 2008, popular CCM singer Ray Boltz announced his homosexuality. After 33 years of marriage and four children, he divorced his wife to live with a man. Also in 2008, Clay Aiken, a Southern Baptist who was runner-up on American Idol in 2003 and went on to become a multiplatinum recording artist, admitted publicly that he is homosexual. In 2010, Anthony Williams, who performs under the name of Tonex and whose album Out the Box was nominated for a Grammy, revealed that he is a homosexual. Also in 2010, Jennifer Knapp, hardrocking Contemporary Christian musician, came "out of the closet" with her lesbianism. In April 2014, Dan Haseltine of the popular CCM band Jars of Clay announced his support for "gay marriage." In August 2014, Vicky Beeching, British CCM musician, announced that she is a lesbian. In 2016, Trey Pearson, lead singer of the popular Christian rock band Everyday Sunday, came out as "gay." His "coming out" was presented in terms of "being true" to himself. The 614 Magazine cover story was titled "Gay, Christian Rock Star: This Is Who I Am."

A 55-YEAR-OLD WARNING THAT ROCK CANNOT BE CHRISTIANIZED

"The [rock] medium is so anti-Christian in its ethos-libertarian, antiauthoritarian, equating infatuation and sexual attraction with love, and on the drug-culture fringe--that when Christians assume that ethos to communicate the message of self-denial, crossbearing and following Christ then it utterly mangles the message" (Colin Chapman, "Modern Music and Evangelism," Background to the Task, Evangelical Alliance Commission on Evangelism, 1968). Comment by the Friday Church News Notes Editor: This powerful warning, issued 55 years ago, was ignored by evangelicals to their own spiritual confusion. Now it is being ignored by fundamentalists and independent Baptists, and the effect will be the same, because the warning is absolutely true.



The following is excerpted from "Made in His Image: The Connecting Power of Hands," R. Guliuzza, M.D., Institute for Creation Research: "Human finger movements excel in precision and speed. The average time a person takes to make a common choice between two things is about half of a second. But rapid finger motions are much faster--in fact even faster than is physically possible using only the body's sensor-to-motor loops. To obtain the highest possible finger speeds, sensors and conscious thought are augmented in the brain with an anticipatory function for individual finger movements called a forward plan, which is extraordinarily complex and significantly subconscious. Evidence shows that the central nervous system predicts the best outcome of every finger movement several movements ahead of its current state. Thus, skilled typists will visually process up to eight characters in advance and then--in anticipation--the forward plan for muscle movements will commit the finger muscles to an action about three characters in advance of actually striking the keys. Times between keystrokes are commonly as low as 60 milliseconds. Interestingly, speed is fastest if successive keystrokes are between fingers on opposite hands. So imagine the quantity of mental data processed for a skilled pianist who can play 20-30 successive notes with each hand every second--about 40 milliseconds apart--since the nervous system executes a forward plan (prescribing speed, direction, pressure, duration, etc.) for every finger simultaneously and updates all plans after every successive finger movement. The plan is compiled in the cerebellum, which may, if needed, retain memory of the plan (one or several varieties). This becomes an integral part of skilled learning. So far, no limits have been found on the number of plans that can be kept in memory."
